7. Approve Byrne-Jag application to partially fund School Reserve Officer

Chief Porter is requesting approval of an application to Byrne-Justice Assistance Grant Program to partially fund the SRO's salary for the 2012 FY. The request includes the City paying 25% of the officer's salary and the school district paying 15% of the officer's salary. A draft of the application is attached (2-7). The City was funded by this program 2-years ago, but did not receive funding for this FY.

8. Resolution 2011-24: Approve contract for 11th Street Improvements and Reconstruction Project 2011 (8)

Resolution 2011-24 approves a contract for the 11th Street Project. This project includes the reconstruction and widening of 11th Street from the Humeston Road to east of the new school entrance. This new stretch of road will have 3 lanes with turning lanes at East 4th Avenue and the new school entrance. In the end this project will include signals at the East 4th Ave. and 11th Street intersection, but these will be bid out separately. Bids for this project are due the afternoon of March 17. The bid tab is attached (9).

9. Resolution 2011-25: Approve contract for 10th Street Improvements and Reconstruction Project 2011 (10)

Resolution 2011-25 approves a contract for the 10th Street Project. This project includes the reconstruction of 10th Street from 5th Avenue to 1st Avenue. Bids for this project are due the afternoon of March 17. The bid tab is attached (11).

10. Resolution 2011-26: Approve contract for East Side Storm Water Improvement Project 2011 (12)

Resolution 2011-26 approves a contract for the East Side Storm Water Improvement Project. This project includes the construction of a detention area on the Porth Property and the cleaning and reshaping of the drainage ditch that runs from 11th Street to East 3rd Avenue, and including the ditches on East Industrial Drive. Bids for this project are due the afternoon of March 17. The bid tab is attached (13)

11. Resolution 2011-27: Accepting Lot 6A as additional 10th Street Right of Way (14)

Resolution 2011-27 approves the acceptance of lot 6A as additional 10th Street right of way. The City requested this additional ROW from Grace Lutheran Church to accommodate correctly aligning 10th Street at 5th Avenue and to provide similar parking in the this area. In total this is 2,386 square feet. A plat is attached that shows the area (15). The cooperation

of Grace Lutheran Church has been greatly appreciated on this project. Ironically, this area was at one time a part of the ROW.

12. Resolution 2011-28: Release Assessment Waiver on Garden Green Estates Subdivision (16)

Resolution 2011-28 approves the release of the Assessment Waiver on the Garden Green Estates Subd. The assessment waiver is originally secured to give the City the authority to fully assess property owners for the installation of the infrastructure in new subdivisions if the developers do not do so in a timely manner. In this case the improvements have all been installed and in place for 4-years. The Assessment Waiver shows up as a defect on the title; releasing makes it easier for property transactions. The assessment waiver and approving resolution are attached (17-18).

13. Resolution 2011-29: Approve Development Agreement for Pennigroth 1st Addition (19)

Last summer the City worked with the Duane Petsche and Gary Pennigroth on a Development Agreement (attached 20-21) pertaining to the extension of the sewer in Pennigroth 1st Addition. The agreement details the financial responsibilities for the extension of the sanitary sewer, which in general will be split between Petsche and Pennigroth if an extension is necessary. The City Council had reviewed this agreement and unofficially approved it. For the purposes of the record and having the document recorded it is preferred to have an approving resolution.

14. Consider reimbursement to Clinton Area of Chamber for Legislative trip planning/coordination

Attached is an invoice from Clinton County Area Chamber of Commerce for reimbursement of their costs for planning and coordinating the D.C. and Des Moines Capitol trips (22). In addition to planning and coordination they have costs for lunch for the Iowa Legislators and for food for the Federal Reps and their staffs. Although in the form of an invoice, this is more a recommendation. I would suggest that the City provide some financial support for these efforts.

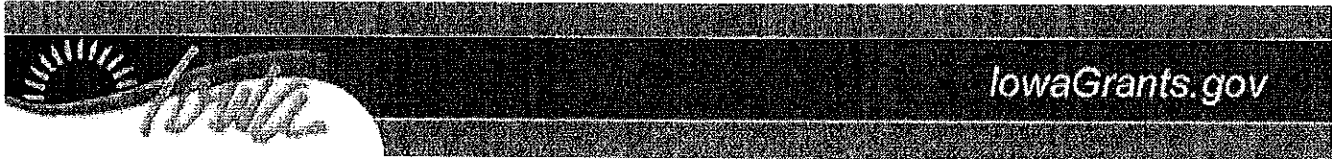

The City of DeWitt is a growing community in Eastern Iowa located in very close proximity to the Quad Cities metropolitan area, which is a metro area of approximately 350,000 people. DeWitt has a strong and growing diversified industrial base of about 1,300 jobs and serves as a bedroom community for those that work in the Quad Cities and Clinton. DeWitt has been averaging a 10%-

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12% growth rate with current population estimates of just over 5,300 people. Additionally, there are two four lane US highways (US-61 and US-30) that intersect in DeWitt. These highways are major transportation routes through Eastern Iowa and serve as drug trafficking routes for drug runners to avoid the interstate highway system and easy identification and detection of Interstate 80 which is only 15 miles South of DeWitt. Consequently, these transportation routes along with the close proximity to metropolitan areas put DeWitt at the crossroads of drug and other criminal activity in the region.

In the last three years the DeWitt Police Department has witnessed a significant increase in drug and alcohol activity with 195 alcohol related incidents resulting in 195 arrests, and 79 drug related incidents resulting in 70 arrests. Unfortunately 28 incidents of 195 alcohol related incidents involved juveniles and 13 of the 79 drug related incidents involved juveniles.

This high rate of alcohol and drug related incidents involving juveniles is part of a national trend especially involving the use of prescription drugs. National statistics published by the President's Office of Drug Control Policy cite that teens between the ages of 12-17 and young adults between the ages of 18-25 are more likely than older adults to start abusing prescription drugs. To back up these statistics in the City of DeWitt over the last three years we have participated in a county wide prescription drug drop off program to rid our community of unneeded prescription drugs. The quantity of drugs being dropped off has almost doubled since the first year, and last year the City of DeWitt collected 144 pounds of prescription drugs, compared to only 82 pounds the first year and 96 pounds the second year. Overall in Clinton County 1522 pounds of prescription drugs have been collected in a three year period. These type of numbers help demonstrate the availability of prescription drugs to our youth in DeWitt specifically in and around the schools.

The lack of having a full time SRO has added to these problems described above, as we have seen increases in both on and off campus incidents of youth involved drug and alcohol violations. The significant increase over the last three years of unneeded prescription drugs available in our community is also very troubling and counter productive to our goal of creating a community that is free from illegal drug and alcohol usage. In the past these numbers were significantly less because of the work the SRO did with education and rapport building while at the same time providing a positive role model for the youth in our community.

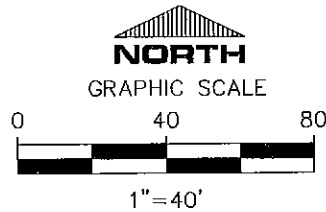

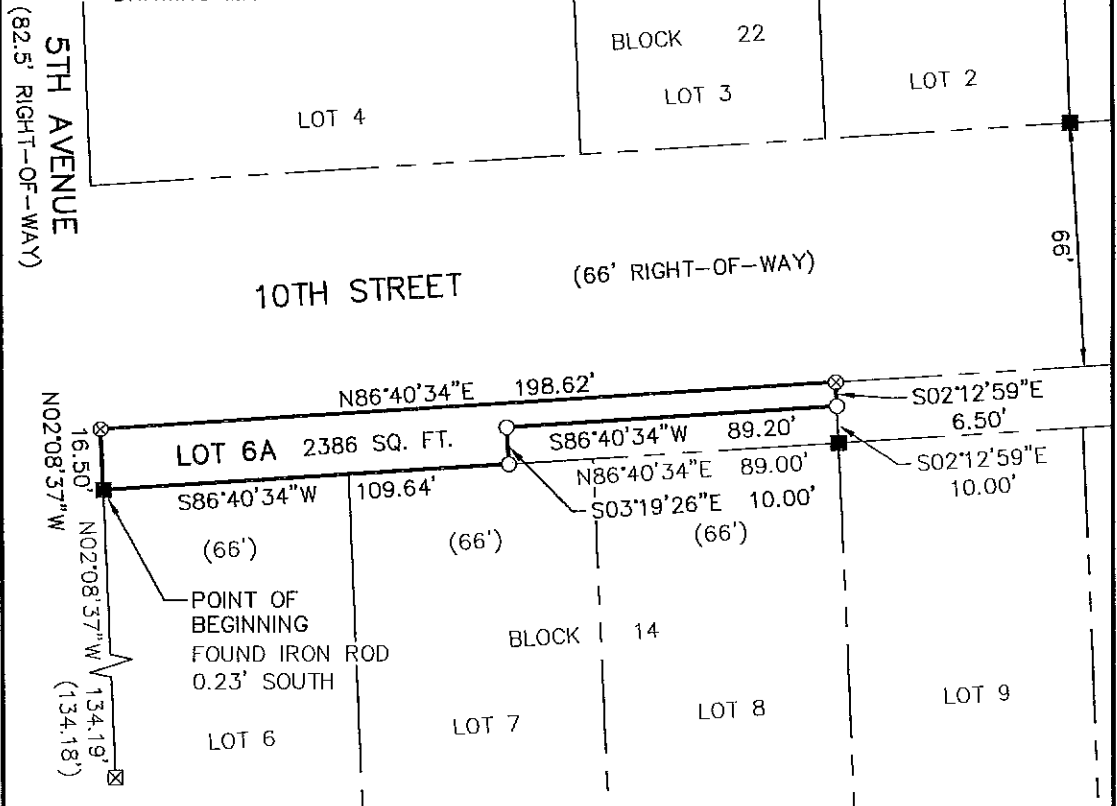
LOT 6A OF BLOCK 14 IN THE CITY OF DEWITT, CLINTON COUNTY, IOWA

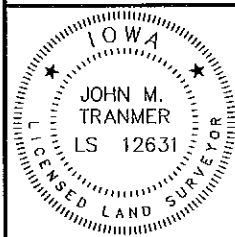

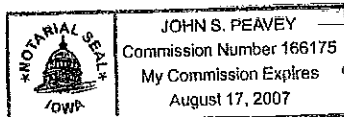

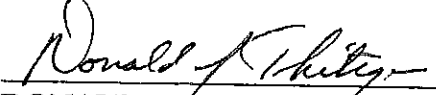

Development Agreement

RE: Lot one (1) and Lot two (2) Pennigroth First Addition to the City of Dewitt, Clinton County, Iowa

Whereas, The DeWitt City Council approved the Final Plat of Pennigroth First Addition, a 2.5-acre, 2-lot subdivision on September 19, 2005; and,

Whereas, Resolution 2005-100 provided that Pennigroth 1st Addition was approved upon the condition that "That sanitary sewer be provided to the subdivision"; and,

Whereas, sanitary sewer has been installed to the southern boundary of the property and adjacent to Westbrook Drive; and,

Whereas, Duane Petsche is the owner of lot 2 of Pennigroth 1st addition and has taken out a permit to construct a singly family home on that lot requiring the extension of the sewer to serve lot 2; and,

Whereas, City of DeWitt Public Works has stated that it is there policy that upon the development a subdivision's infrastructure the utilities shall be extended to the property line for the next potential development, and in this case that requires the extension of the sanitary sewer to the northern boundary of the subdivision adjacent to Westwood Drive; and;

Whereas, Duane Petsche owner of lot 2 and Gary Pennigroth owner of lot 1 and developer of the subdivision petitioned the Council to reconsider the extension of the sanitary sewer to the northern boundary of the subdivision.

Now, therefore, it is mutually agreed by and between the undersigned parties as follows:

1. The City Council will not at this time require the extension of the sanitary sewer to the northern boundary of Pennigroth 1st Addition. Duane Petsche will be required to connect to the sanitary sewer main on a stub that is north of the most northern manhole on the said sewer per typical City standards.
2. At the time of any future development in the area or any other situation occurs which in the sole discretion of the City of Dewitt necessitates the extension of the sanitary sewer line that currently terminates near the southern boundary of Pennigroth 1st Addition the owners of Lot 1 and Lot 2 of Pennigroth 1st Addition their successors and assigns shall be equally responsible for the cost including engineering, permitting, staking, inspection and construction of extending said 8" sanitary sewer to the northern boundary of Pennigroth 1st Addition adjacent to Lake Street. The City shall review and certify the actual cost; and then invoice each owner for half of the certified cost. The owners shall have 1 year from the time

that the invoice is presented to them to make payment. If the owners fail to make the required payment the City of Dewitt shall certify the costs together with any collection expenses incurred to the County Treasurer as a special assessment collectible as taxes.

3. If the sewer is upsized to serve additional development the owners of lot 1 and lot 2 shall not be responsible for the additional cost to upsize the sewer and shall have the difference between the costs of the larger sewer and the 8 inch sewer deducted from the final invoice.
4. In the event that it is not necessary to extend the sanitary sewer to the northern boundary to serve additional development the owners of lot 1 and lot 2 shall only be responsible for the actual costs required to extend the sewer to the additional development. However, if this includes crossing Westwood Drive to the west the owners shall be responsible for the cost of extending the sewer half of the distance across the Westwood Drive right-of-way.
5. This development agreement shall be placed of record with the Clinton County recorder and shall constitute an encumbrance on title as against the indicated real estate lien for deferred improvement costs which shall exist until such time that the improvements are installed.
6. This agreement runs with the land and is binding upon the heirs, assigns and all subsequent purchasers.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF DEWITT, IOWA, 2010, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO MUNICIPAL INFRACTIONS

Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of DeWitt, Iowa:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 4.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of DeWitt, Iowa, 2010, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

4.04 CIVIL CITATIONS. Any officer authorized by the City to enforce this Code of Ordinances may issue a civil citation to a person who commits a municipal infraction. A copy of the citation may be served by personal service as provided in Rule of Civil Procedure 1.305, by certified mail addressed to the defendant at defendant's last known mailing address, return receipt requested, or by publication in the manner as provided in Rule of Civil Procedure 1.310 and subject to the conditions of Rule of Civil Procedure 1.311. A copy of the citation shall be retained by the issuing officer, and the original citation shall be sent to the Clerk of the District Court. The citation shall serve as notification that a civil offense has been committed and shall contain the following information:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.22[4])

1. The name and address of the defendant.
2. The name or description of the infraction attested to by the officer issuing the citation.
3. The location and time of the infraction.
4. The amount of civil penalty to be assessed or the alternative relief sought, or both.
5. The manner, location, and time in which the penalty may be paid.
6. The time and place of court appearance.
7. The penalty for failure to appear in court.
8. The legal description of the affected real property, if applicable.

If the citation affects real property and charges a violation relating to the condition of the property, including a building code violation, a local housing regulation violation, a housing code violation, or a public health or safety violation, after filing the citation with the Clerk of the District Court, the City shall also file the citation in the office of the County Treasurer.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 1. SECTION ADDED. The Code of Ordinances of the City of DeWitt, Iowa, 2010, is amended by adding a new Section 41.14, entitled PROVIDING FALSE IDENTIFICATION INFORMATION, which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

41.14 PROVIDING FALSE IDENTIFICATION INFORMATION. No person shall knowingly provide false identification information to anyone known by the person to be a peace officer, emergency medical care provider, or firefighter, whether paid or volunteer, in the performance of any act that is within the scope of the lawful duty or authority of that officer, emergency medical care provider, or firefighter.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 719.1A)

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 1. SUBSECTION MODIFIED. Subsection 13 of Section 136.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of DeWitt, Iowa, 2010, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

13. Curb Ramps and Sloped Areas for Persons with Disabilities. If a street, road, or highway is newly built or reconstructed, a curb ramp or sloped area shall be constructed or installed at each intersection of the street, road, or highway with a sidewalk or path. If a sidewalk or path is newly built or reconstructed, a curb ramp or sloped area shall be constructed or installed at each intersection of the sidewalk or path with a street, highway, or road. Curb ramps and sloped areas that are required pursuant to this subsection shall be constructed or installed in compliance with applicable Federal requirements adopted in accordance with the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act, including (but not limited to) the guidelines issued by the Federal Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 216C.9)

62.01 VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS. Any person who willfully fails or refuses to comply with any lawful order of a peace officer or direction of a Fire Department officer during a fire, or who fails to abide by the applicable provisions of the following Iowa statutory laws relating to motor vehicles and the statutory law of the road is in violation of this section. These sections of the *Code of Iowa* are adopted by reference and are as follows:

2. All Terrain Vehicles, Golf Carts, and Bicycles to Obey Traffic Regulations, Radar Jamming Devices, Road Workers: 321.232 through 321.234A, 235A and 321.247.
3. Traffic Signs, Signals, and Markings: 321.259 and 321.260.
4. Accidents and Accident Reporting: 321.262 through 321.266.
5. Operation of Motorcycles and Motorized Bicycles: 321.275.
6. Drag Racing; Speed; Open Containers; Control of Vehicle: 321.276, 321.277, 321.277A, 321.278, 321.281, 321.284, 321.284A, 321.288, 321.295, 321.333, 321.382 and 321.383.
7. Driving on Right, Meeting, Overtaking, Following, or Towing: 321.297 through 321.299 and 321.302 through 321.310.
8. Turning and Starting, Signals on Turning and Stopping: 321.312 through 321.318.

10. Pedestrian Rights and Duties and Safety Zones: 321.329, 321.330, 321.332, 321.333, and 321.340.
11. Railroad Crossings: 321.341 through 321.344 and 321.344B.
12. Stopping, Standing, Parking: 321.354 and 321.359.
13. Unattended Vehicle, Obstructing Driver's View, Crossing Median, Following Fire Apparatus, or Crossing Fire Hose, and Putting Glass, Etc., on Streets: 321.362 through 321.365 and 321.367 through 321.371.
14. School Buses: 321.372.
15. Lighting Equipment Required and Time of Use: 321.384 through 321.390, 321.392 through 321.395, 321.398, 321.402 through 321.405, 321.408, 321.409, 321.415, 321.417 through 321.423. In accordance with authorization granted by Section 321.395, *Code of Iowa*, motor vehicles parked upon any street where permitted by this chapter need not display required lights where there is sufficient light emitted from City street

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lights to reveal any person or object within a distance of five hundred (500) feet upon such street.

16. Brakes, Horns, Sirens, Mufflers, Wipers, Mirrors, Tires, Flares, Windows, Safety Belts, and Special Markings for Transporting Explosives: 321.430 through 321.434; 321.436 through 321.442; 321.444 through 321.446, 321.449 and 321.450.

17. Size, Weight, and Load: 321.454 through 321.458, 321.460 through 321.463, 321.465 and 321.466.

18. Unsafe Vehicles: 321.381 and 321.381A.
